12:50 P.M. PRESIDENTIAL EXECUTIVE ORDER

President Obama signed Executive Order #13508 on May 12, 2009, calling upon the Federal government to control pollution that flows to the Chesapeake Bay and protect wildlife habitats in the region. Federal agencies were given 120 days to draft seven reports outlining the next generation of Federal tools and actions needed to advance Bay restoration, including changes to regulations, programs and policies to implement these actions. September 9th marks the 120th day and the reports will be released today. A 60-day comment period follows with final reports due November 9, 2009. This meeting is largely devoted to an examination of these reports to facilitate the development of CBC's comments on the drafts.
