

Investors or banks provide upfront capital to scale outcomesbased projects



Contractors deliver environmental outcomes and cost savings that government values.


Government pays contractor (who repays investor or bank) once outcomes are verified





# State PFS program, ResultsOhio, established in 2020








2011 - law authorizing a PFS pilot Feasibility study State bonds for up to \$10 million Need legislation to simplify processes



What	Controllable actions you take to achieve a goal	Initial results your actions produce, mostly under your control	The effect of your actions in the project	The long term effect of all of your actions
Measurement	Inputs are the results of activities and measure effort. Inputs are binary – they were either accomplished or not	Outputs measure immediate results based on the inputs	Outcomes measure longer-term consequences stemming from the combination of inputs and outputs	Ultimate outcomes measure long-term consequences stemming from outcomes and other factors
Examples	<ul> <li>Bulldozer operator hours</li> <li>Seeds planted</li> <li>Supplies used</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Acres protected</li> <li>Living shorelines created</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Saplings that survive one year</li> <li>Percent living seagrass cover after 2 years</li> </ul>	<ul><li>Forested acres</li><li>Delistable streams</li></ul>
