
Many of our grant programs are operated as pooled funds with federal, state, and local funding partners.





The Need for Technical Assistance



- The watershed is predominantly held in private ownership
- Bridging the knowledge gap and building trust
- Overcoming complexity
- Increasing confidence
- Addressing site specific challenges
- Addressing resource barriers



Connector Group Technical Assistance Model

Key Point: Not everyone is their own best messenger

Who: Community Based Organizations, Connectors & TA Providers

What: Outreach, technical assistance, grants

How: Pair connectors with experts in the field to provide TA to applicants and awardees

Outcomes: New applicants with increased capacity to apply for and manage funds.

Capacity Building Initiative - TA Model

Key Point: Networks work but require investment

Who: Local Networks of cross-sector organizations committed to working collaboratively. Example – Lancaster Clean Water Partners

What: Includes training, technical assistance, and grants.

How: Leverages the social science of networks to accelerate innovation

Outcomes: Measurable capacity built to accomplish shared goals at the

intersection of community and watershed health.

Deepens trust and increases impact.

Re-construct the north parking area with permeable materials; both permeable interlocking concrete pavers and reinforced turf grass pavers. In addition, two hillside micro -bioretention areas are proposed adjacent to pedestrian ramp improvements. Upon completion of the green infrastructure improvements, the lot should be re -striped, signed, and marked according to the proposed site plan.

In Summary



Takeaways:

- 1.Information is not enough; most audiences need technical assistance
- 2.If you don't center people in program design, you will waste time and money

Recommendations:

- 1. You must involve priority audiences in the design of legislation to ensure you are addressing key barriers to implementation
- 2.Don't just tally up supply costs for ecological restoration; budget specifically for community engagement and TA costs in legislation
